Dear Brother,

It's hard to believe almost a year has passed since you gathered at a Lehigh football game in order to help raise funds for my recovery, as a result of me suffering a severe spinal cord injury. Thanks to your extreme generosity I was able to help offset some of the staggering medical expenses I have incurred.

While this past year has been challenging for me, I am pleased to say that I've made a tremendous amount of progress. I am breathing completely on my own with no assistance; I will be having a surgery which will allow me to cough, and have my trache removed; I am standing just about every day in my standing machine. Although this may not sound like a big deal, it is to me, considering the fact that the doctors once told me I would never be able to breathe on my own or spend an extended amount of time out of bed.

I'm proud of how far I've come, but my journey is nowhere near complete. Now that I am healthy and stable all of my focus is on aggressive and intense physical therapy. One of the most important pieces of equipment I have been told by several therapists that will help me is a passive, motion bike. This will allow me to strenuously move my arms and legs, which will increase circulation, muscle mass, and can help with nerve regeneration. I am eager to hop on a bike. However, as is the case with most medical supplies, the system can be very costly. This year's fundraiser at the football game will be geared towards raising the needed funds to purchase this bike. It can cost up to \$20,000 with accessories. Those of you who know me, know that I hate asking for stuff. One thing this injury has taught me is that there's no room for pride. That is why once again I'm reaching out to the Delts Brotherhood and its generosity to help assist me in purchasing this needed piece of equipment.

The support you showed me last year was overwhelming and far greater than I expected. I was not completely surprised though, knowing what kind of character, compassion and kindness makes up a Delta Tau Delta Brother. I am proud to be among this elite group.

It is still a challenge for me to travel long distances, so it is difficult to commit that I will be there this year. I will certainly be there in spirit and will be thinking of all of you. I know you won't be shy having a beer for me; hopefully it won't be Canada's finest -- Black Label!
